This Week's Speaker

Speaker: Julian Donlen, Bayside City Council
Topic: Bayside Climate Emergency Action Plan

We welcomed Julian Donlen, the Coordinator of Environmental Sustainability for Bayside Council.

He talked about how Council is addressing Climate Change as an emergency. Council has an action plan and gains in its first year include:

- A schools action summit
- Council energy coming from renewable sources
- All Council main buildings powered by renewable energy.
- Some electric vehicles.

Action Plan Status



81 Deliverables and Actions in the Climate Emergency Action Plan

Of these, 67 were planned to be delivered by end of Year 1.

Of these, 52 can be assessed as complete (35) or on track for completion (17), as at 30 Sept 2021.

1 Action unlikely to be delivered



The first year of the Council Plan was internally focussed and now Council staff will be working collaboratively with the community.

Council is working on waste diversion, 60% is currently not going to landfill. Litter on the foreshore is a problem.

Another win is the Urban Forest development in Elsternwick.

What is Council doing in 2021/22

- Setting a Community Greenhouse Gas Emissions Reduction Target
- Co-design of a Climate Emergency community education campaign
- 'Small Business Energy Saver' program – 85% rebates on appliances
- Continue to replace old streetlights with energy efficient LED lights
- More Electric Vehicle chargers
- Plant more trees, especially in new Elsternwick Park Nature Reserve
- Expansion of 'GreenMoney' behaviour change incentive program
- More solar on Council buildings (and batteries, and phasing out gas ...)
- Advocacy to Governments to address the Climate Emergency



Julian noted the scale of the changes which need to be made each year to maintain global warming at 1.5 degrees

- In 2021/2022 Council will be:
- Setting targets
- A community education campaign with a goal of net zero by 2033
- A small business energy saver programme
- Replacing old street lights
- More electric vehicle chargers
- Planting more trees
- More solar on Council buildings
- Advocacy to Governments to address the Climate Emergency.
